Responsible for collecting and packaging pieces of evidence in securely closed containers such as bags, crates, or boxes, in order to protect them. Examine fire sites and collect evidence such as glass, metal fragments, charred wood, and ignitable liquid residue for use in determining the cause of a fire. Analyze evidence and other information to determine probable cause of fire or explosion. Photograph damage and evidence related to causes of fires or explosions in order to document investigation findings.

Responsible for the day to day operations of the fire crews on emergency responses and the daily activities of the fire crews.

Fire Marshal

Responsible for all aspects of fire prevention, this includes: Fire inspections, code enforcement, fire investigations, public education, plans review, writing of the codes and standards.

I was assigned to the fire prevention bureau as an Assistant Fire Marshal. I was the lead fire investigator for our department. I was also responsible for all aspects of fire prevention which include: plans review ranging from single family residential to commercial, fire sprinklers, fire alarms,

propane tank installation, fire hydrant civil plans and commercial hood systems. I perform occupancy inspections in both new and existing buildings, and code enforcement. Responsible for issuing permits for tents, fireworks, hazardous materials and all other permits required by the fire code. I also assist in the writing of our codes, policies and interpretations.
